Dr Andy Morris MB, ChB, DMRD, FRCR is a highly experienced radiologist who has had a special interest in musculoskeletal imaging and MRI for over 20 years. He trained in Medicine and Radiology at Liverpool Medical School and has been a Consultant Radiologist at Salisbury District Hospital since 1984 where he also worked in the Duke of Cornwall's Spinal Treatment Centre. He has experience in most aspects of radiology and was a key investigator in the research and development of the AECC's quantitative fluoroscopy systems.

Dr Ravi Ayer BSc (Hons) BM, MRCS, FRCR qualified from the University of Southampton in 2001. After undertaking a fellowship in musculoskeletal radiology in the Frenchay and Southmead hospitals in Bristol, he was appointed Consultant Radiologist in Poole NHS Foundation Trust in 2012. He is an experienced radiologist whose expertise covers musculoskeletal trauma, fractures and soft tissue injury; spinal trauma; bone and soft tissue cancer; sports injury; musculoskeletal infection; degenerative musculoskeletal disease and rheumatological disease. Dr Andy Pope BSc, MBBS, MRCP (UK), FRCR is a consultant musculoskeletal radiologist.
