Monika Barnes

Monika joined as an Independent Governor in September 2021 and is Deputy Chair of the Board of Governors. She is also Chair of the People & Place and Remuneration Committees and is a member of the Governance & Nominations Committee. She has a MSc in Organisational Behaviour from Birkbeck, a post graduate Diploma in Management Studies from Kingston University and is a History graduate of the University of Manchester. She also has a post graduate qualification in Executive Coaching from the Institute of Leadership and Management.

Monika started her career heading up a variety of training and development roles for organisations such as the BBC, ITV and Channel 4. She then set up her own consulting practice specialising in organisational and culture change delivering a range of pragmatic and transformational solutions to a variety of clients across the commercial and not for profit sectors. During her career she has advised global film studios, broadcasters, media agencies, global luxury brands, engineering design specialists, law firms, workplace design experts, unions, universities, political parties amongst many more. As a result of an increasing focus on diversity, Monika created a separate strand to her business and launched Career Savvy Women to offer specific support to increase the numbers of women in senior roles.

Monika is an independent board director of Goldsmiths College, University of London where she sits on the Governance and Human Resources Committees and is a board director of Lighthouse, the largest regional venue for performing arts outside of London.





Jeni Bremner joined as an Independent Governor in October 2019 and in April 2020 became Chair of the Board of Governors. She is also Chair of the Governance & Nominations Committee and sits on the Finance & Performance Committee.

Jeni graduated from Leeds University and, after then training as a Nurse, worked with People with HIV and AIDs setting up support and services in the 1980's and 1990's. She gained an MSc in Health Economics in the mid 90's and returned to work in the NHS as a policy advisor. In 1997 Jeni was seconded to the Local Government Association where she spent ten years leading the health and social care agenda and was a member of the LGA Board. In 2007 she moved to Brussels as Chief Executive of the European Health Management Association, a pan European membership organisation that focused on innovation and good practice in health management and health management education. In 2016 she gave up work to care for her Stepfather who had Alzheimer's during which time she also became deputy chair of Southern Health Foundation Trust.



Joy Conway

Professor Joy Conway joined as an Independent Governor in October 2022 and sits on the People & Place Committee. Joy is the Professor of Respiratory Sciences, Centre for Health, Medicine and Life Sciences (CHMLS), Brunel University London. Joy has extensive experience as a researcher and educator with over 25 years in UK Higher Education Institutions.

Joy has a strong interest in lung disease, the care of those with lung disease, respiratory physiology and pathophysiology and lung imaging. Following qualification as a chartered physiotherapist and a Masters in Rehabilitation (University of Southampton) her PhD (University of Southampton) investigated the use of three-dimensional lung imaging techniques to quantify inhaled aerosol deposition in the lung and structural and functional changes that occur with disease. Joy then progressed through to a personal Chair at the University of Southampton in 2009. In 2019 Joy was appointed as Professor of Respiratory Sciences at Brunel University London, where she is co-Director of the Smart Technology Advancements for Health and Rehabilitation research centre and Director of the Applied Respiratory Research Group.

Joy is also the national research lead for advancing clinical practice for Health Education England; and maintains visiting Professor status with the NIHR Southampton Biomedical Research Centre for Respiratory and Critical Care and the University of Winchester.





Michael has been an Independent Governor since November 2019 and is a member of Finance & Performance Committee and Chairs the Digital Sub-Committee. Michael is currently Vice-Chair of the Board of Governors at Arts University Bournemouth and leads major capital projects oversight for the board.

He is also a careers advisor for a career and enterprise company. Prior to his retirement, Michael was a partner at PricewaterhouseCoopers where he served in a number of key leadership roles. He has also spent time in management consulting and at Ford Motor Company (UK and North American HO).
