How things grow?

How do plants grow? What do they need to grow and stay healthy? How is this different to what we need as humans to grow and be healthy?

We invite you to run an experiment to find out more. Choose some seeds or bulbs and plant them (schools can request a pack for their students from our website). Plant your seeds and record how they grow.

Key Stage 2 students might like to compare more than one type of seed and/or re-plant seeds from common fruits and vegetables to see if they germinate and grow. Another idea could be trying different conditions for growing seeds (for example, different temperatures, light and dark) to see if they grow differently.

You can present your project in any format you like. We can't wait to see your experiments and what you found out!

Topic ideas:

Keep a diary as your plant grows of how it changes day to day	Draw a comic strip of your plant as it changes	Take photographs of your plant as it changes to form a timeline
Draw and label a picture of your seed and plant as it grows	Experiment with different seeds and label how each differs as it grows	Keep seeds from fruit and vegetables you eat (for example tomato seeds). What happens if you plant them? Record your findings
